If you know where you are going to college, I urge you to go online and fill out an application and start looking at requirements, housing, scholarships, deadlines, etc. After you have filled out your college application, please come sign up to have your TSI and transcript sent, so that we can send the college a partial transcript, which admissions must have in order to process your file. Also, the LEARN representative can assist you with these applications in addition to financial aid. Please remember your appointment times.

If you are a male, a US citizen, and are 18, you must register for the Selective Service within 30 days of your 18th birthday. Remember this is the **law!** You can register online at www.sss.gov or pick up a registration card at the post office; you can register early when you are 17 years and 3 months old. You will not be able to get any federal financial assistance without completing this process.

As we get closer to second semester, I wanted to remind you of how class rank was calculated. This is a clip from our student/parent handbook:

*“Class rank for seniors shall be based on a weighted grade average using semester grades earned in grades 9-12 and any high school course taken in grade 8 for state graduation credit. **Class rank shall be calculated at the end of the fifth six-week grading period of the senior year.**”*

This means that any dual credit classes you take the second semester (of your senior year) will not count towards your GPA or class rank since SPC does not report grades to us until the week before graduation. However, you are still welcome to take dual credit classes.
